Time flies as it's been two years since I became the Chair of York Chapter. Over the past 2 years, York Chapter has been extremely busy with the successful implementation of the following three new initiatives:

1. High School Scholarship
2. Accelerated Mentoring program
3. Pilot program for Engineer-In-Training (EIT) mentoring

The High School Scholarship program was so successful that the chapter was able to award 5 scholarships to students who chose engineering as their field of study after completing high school. PEO only provided funding for 2 scholarships but York Chapter was able to raise money from events and private donations to maintain 5 scholarships this past year; we are continually looking at more funding to be able to provide more scholarships in the future.

The Accelerated Mentoring Program which ran for the very first time this year was a success with around 100 Professional Engineering mentors and mentees. Participants' feedback was very positive and this initiative has greatly helped the participants in their career planning.

York Chapter had the honour to launch the first Pilot Program for EITs. This program helped EITs seek career guidance and provided them with first hand knowledge from mentors who are seasoned engineers in their respective disciplines. The successful completion of this Pilot Program will see this program being rolled out to the other chapters.

Additionally, York Chapter is very strong participant in the mentoring program at York and Ryerson University. This year, Ryerson was introduced to A Guest Lecturer For a Day program with Ed Poon taking the lead. The program is still at its infancy stage and should be beneficial to both mentors and students. The program provided students with what a practicing Professional Engineer does via a presentation at Ryerson.



Companies or individual engineers are asked to provide a workplace issue to the students and the students/mentor will meet 3 times in a school term to brainstorm and offer suggestions to resolve the proposed issue. Some students questioned the implication of design mistakes and human resources constraints on the project timeline. Gord and Matthew shared their personal experience on how to recover from ever-increasing customer demand and technical uncertainties. Students got a first hand exposure to many P.Engs' hard work and dedication.

Prof. George Zhu concluded the lecture by thanking the York Chapter executive team for making this event a success.

2011 Chapter Executive Nominations

The nominating committee of PEO York Chapter is accepting nominations for the Chapter Directorate. The chapter executives are volunteer members who donate time and effort to participate in the operations and functions of the chapter.

There is no direct monetary compensation, except for certain out-of-pocket expenses. The elected executives are required to attend monthly meetings and participate in certain events/functions. Additional time commitments will vary depending upon the particular role/function of each position.

Pertinent sections of the chapter by-laws Article 4 are:

1. The Directorate shall be not less than six (6) members and not more than twelve (12) members. A quorum shall be five (5).
2. A nominating committee comprised of one (1) member of the current directorate and two (2) members at large shall be appointed by the current executive. A notice shall be sent annually to all members requesting nominations for the directorate. The nominations must be received by the



committee two (2) weeks prior to the Annual General Meeting (AGM). Nominations must bear the signature of two (2) nominators and the nominee. A nominee must be a member of the chapter.

3. A slate of candidates including all those properly nominated shall be proposed by the nominating committee for presentation at AGM.

4. The directorate shall be elected at the AGM from the proposed slate of candidates.

5. The directorate will meet immediately after the AGM to elect the officers from its members.

6. The officers shall be Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary and Treasurer. The immediate Past Chair shall be an officer ex-officio. The office of Secretary and Treasurer may be combined.

All nominations must be received by the committee two (2) weeks prior to the Annual General Meeting (AGM), at the address below, by January 22, 2011. All York members are encouraged to attend and partake in the election process.

Education News

Design Challenge

PEO York Chapter held its 11th annual Design Challenge for teams of grade 7 and 8 students from schools in York Region in March at Newmarket High School. A total of 74 students were registered from fifteen teams representing a mix of schools from York's catholic and public boards as well as one independent school.

This year's challenge was to design and build a car that would protect an egg from cracking after rolling down an inclined ramp and hitting a fixed barrier. The students were supplied with a list of specified requirements for the car, a fixed set of materials and then designed and built their cars during the event. The teams were judged on planning and concept development, car design and construction before the cars were crash tested on the ramp. Scoring was based on a combination of the pre-test judging and performance during the crash tests.

The crash testing was run as a single elimination competition with the ramp slope being increased through 4 different inclinations. After each test, the egg was removed from the car and inspected for damage. If the egg was cracked the team was eliminated from the competition. If there was no damage to the egg, the team could do minor repairs to the car and moved on to the next level. In the end, four teams built cars that passed the final ramp height

There were special guests in attendance at the event, including Ontario MPPs Frank Klees and Julia Munro, and Newmarket Mayor Tony Van Bynen. The event was organized by the PEO

York Chapter Education Committee with 20 volunteers out supporting the event from PEO and OACETT.

Scholarship Program

For the second year, PEO York Chapter has supported 5 University Entrance Scholarships of \$500 each for students graduating from a secondary school in the York Chapter area who were going on to take engineering at a Canadian university.

The scholarships were awarded based on the each of the student's contributions in the community, their involvement in intra and extracurricular activities, and their intention to make a career in the profession of engineering.

The winners were: Sakina Essajee of Markham who is starting Civil Engineering at the University of Toronto; Beth Gimpoli of Newmarket who is starting Engineering at McMaster University; Chun Kei Tang of Markham who is starting Engineering Science



at the University of Toronto; Joshua Vermont of Aurora who is starting Nanotechnology Engineering at the University of Waterloo; and Sophie Yu of Richmond Hill who is starting Mechanical Engineering Co-op at the University of Waterloo.

E.I.C. Program

The Education Committee continues to run the Engineer in the Classroom (EIC) Program which is a partnership between engineers and educators that brings real-world experience to the teaching of science, technology and mathematics. The program connects teachers with volunteer engineers who spend part of a day in a classroom presenting the engineering profession to a group of young minds and helping them see the connection between what is being taught in school and its applications in industry and everyday life.

The contest was split into two levels: "junior" (up to grade 6) and "senior" (from grades 7 and 8). 80 children from across the region competed for fun and prizes. Mathletics is a competition designed to create a passion in the application of mathematics in solving day-to-day scientific and engineering problems. The participants used wireless clickers to enter their answers into the central computer that recorded all of the responses and compiled the results for the competition.

The chapter was honoured to have special guest Raymond Li, Sr. Director, IC Design Engineering for Advanced Micro Devices, Inc. (AMD) open the ceremony with some words of encouragement and inspiration for the kids.

The York Chapter is also thankful to participate as 1 of 5 pilot chapters in the PEO Mentorship Program, which pairs EITs one-on-one with a senior engineer to provide guidance and support as they progress towards professional licensure. The chapter will continue to facilitate mentor-protégé follow-up, culminating in a networking event in December 2010.

The chapter is committed to continue engaging with our members to expand our mentorship program in 2011. We look forward to your participation.
