We have over 15 pairs of P.Eng. guides matched with EITs in the *Licensure Assistance Program* (LAP). The P.Eng. guide is matched with an EIT to advise them about the licensing process.

A *Mock PPE exam and review session* was conducted in March to help prepare EITs writing the Professional Practice Examination. A *Road to P.Eng.* seminar was held in October to explain the steps of the licensing process. This was followed by a networking Lunch and a fun event where we took on midway, video and arcade games.

We held a successful *E2E Networking* event in October where a networking guru taught the essentials of networking and provided tips and techniques to effectively network in different scenarios. Right after, we put those skills to the test by networking with engineers and EITs.

2015 AMD Mathletics Competition

Mathletics competitions are all about having fun by applying math skills to solve everyday engineering problems. The questions reflect the Grade 5 to Grade 8 Ontario elementary school mathematics curriculum. Every year, this event sells out within days. Due to the popularity of Mathletics, we have grown the event to accommodate 120 students this year.

The Education Committee and volunteers worked tirelessly to refine the questions based on previous years' feedback, arranged to have all equipment tested prior to the event, selected the best educational prizes, and ensured that Engineering is at the centre of this competition.

<u>Design Challenge – Drag Racing</u>

For National Engineering Month, PEO York Chapter hosted a Design Challenge for Grade 7 and 8 students in York Region. The challenge was to complete a "Drag Racer". Contestants carved aerodynamically-shaped vehicles that were propelled by nitrogen cartridges down an 80' track. Students worked in groups of four to design and assemble their drag racer prototypes before taking them to for "test runs". Each team's prototype was evaluated by measuring the vehicle's instantaneous maximum speed and average speed over the track. Students used this information for modifications and making improvements to their prototypes. Judging

was based on the student's problem solving skills, design, construction and the racer's final performance.
