CN Tower Climb for the United Way


We started this tradition 3 years ago. Every October a team of good hearted engineers climb 1776 steps to the observation deck


Communication News

2010 Chapter Executive Nominations

The nominating committee of the York Chapter PEO is accepting nominations for the Chapter Directorate. The chapter executives are volunteer members who donate time and effort to participate in the operations and functions of the chapter.

There is no direct monetary compensation, except for certain out-of-pocket expenses. The elected executives are required to attend monthly meetings, and participate in certain events/functions. Additional time commitments will vary depending upon the particular role/function of each position.



Pertinent sections of the chapter by-laws Article 4 are:

1. The Directorate shall be not less than six (6) members and not more than twelve (12) members. A quorum shall be five (5).
2. A nominating committee comprised of one (1) member of the current directorate and two (2) members at large shall be appointed by the current executive. A notice shall be sent annually to all members requesting nominations for the directorate. The nominations must be received by the committee two (2) weeks prior to the Annual General Meeting (AGM). Nominations must bear the signature of two (2) nominators and the nominee. A nominee must be a member of the chapter.
3. A slate of candidates including all those properly nominated shall be proposed by the nominating committee for presentation at AGM.
4. The directorate shall be elected at the AGM from the proposed slate of candidates.
5. The directorate will meet immediately after the AGM to elect the officers from its members.
6. The officers shall be Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary and Treasurer. The immediate Past Chair shall be an officer ex-officio. The office of Secretary and Treasurer may be combined.

To submit your name for nomination, please forward your full name, PEO number, email, phone number to 2010nomination@peoyork.com. For a copy of the York Chapter by-laws, contact Chapter Secretary, Gordon Ip, P.Eng., at secretary@peoyork.com. All nominations must be received by the committee two (2) weeks prior to the Annual General Meeting (AGM), at the address below, by February 1, 2010. All York members are encouraged to attend and partake in the election process.

Our York Chapter was recently presented with the new PEO Government Liaison Project Award at the PEO's fourth annual Queen's Park MPP reception on September 16th. The award was to recognize individual PEO chapters for their efforts to engage local politicians in developing technically sound public policy. The Government Liaison Program Committee (GLPC) won the award based on the work with Oak Ridges-Markham MPP, Dr. Helena Jaczek, who had asked York Chapter engineers to examine the electricity distribution needs in northern York Region.

York Chapter GLPC also recently held a breakfast session with York Simcoe MPP, Ms Julia Munro. The objective of the breakfast session was once again to bring our members together with their elected representatives to learn about topics of importance to the engineering community. Julia spoke about various topics including employment and what needs to be done to help small business to navigate red tape. The breakfast was attended by about 30 members and Julia appreciated the opportunity to meet with engineers who were also mostly her constituents.

Design Challenge

On March 5th, during National Engineering Month 2009, The York Chapter Education Committee held their 10th annual Design Challenge for students in grades 7 and 8. It was the largest design challenge yet, with 16 teams of 5 students each from schools from both the York Region District School Board and the York Catholic District School Board.

The competition was to build the strongest tower out of spaghetti and modelling clay. The teams were judged on their concept development, design and project management as well as the tower's performance in the testing, with the prize going to the team with the best overall score. In addition to a dedicated team of volunteer engineers, Newmarket-Aurora MPP Frank Klees and Newmarket Mayor Tony Van Bynen were on hand to support the kids and help with the judging.

In the end, a team from Unionville Meadows Public School won the top prize.

E.I.C. Program

In 2009 the Education Committee continued with the Engineer in the Classroom (EIC) Program which is a partnership between engineers and educators that brings real-world experience to

the teaching of science, technology and mathematics. The program connects teachers with volunteer engineers who spend part of a day in a classroom presenting the engineering profession to a group of young minds and helping them see the connection between what is being taught in school and its applications in industry and everyday life.


Scholarship Program

Following an exhausting evaluation process, 5 winners of \$500 University Entrance Scholarship Winners were presented with their scholarships at the Fall Certificate Presentation Ceremony. York Chapter Mathletics 2009

The second PEO York Chapter Mathletics competition was held at the Markham Town Centre on November 14th. The contest featured 88 children from the region, evenly split between the "junior" level (up to grade 6) and the "senior" level (from grades 7 and 8).

Mathletics is a competition designed to create a passion in the application of mathematics in solving day-to-day scientific and engineering problems. Students were introduced to technical and engineering concepts with mathematical solutions and challenged to solve them based on the information and formulae provided. The participants used wireless clickers to enter their answers into the central computer that recorded all of the responses and compiled the results for the competition.

University of Toronto professor emeritus Phil Sullivan, P.Eng. opened the ceremony with a talk about the relevance of mathematics in our world today, and Hon. Michael Chan, MPP was on hand to offer congratulations to the participants and hand out the prizes at the end. In addition to prizes for the top three, this year the top 5 of each level were selected to go on to represent York Chapter at the provincial finals in Scarborough.
