Call For Executive Nominations, Annual General Meeting

The nominating committee of the York Chapter PEO is accepting nominations for the Chapter Directorate.

The chapter executives are volunteer members who donate time & effort to participate in the operations and functions of the chapter. There is no direct monetary compensation, except for certain out of pocket expenses. The elected executives are required to attend monthly meetings, and participate in certain events/functions. Additional time commitment will vary upon the particular role/function of each position.

Pertinent sections of the Chapter by-laws are as follows:

Article 4

- 1. The Directorate shall be not less than six (6) members and not more than twelve (12) members. A quorum shall be five (5).
- 2. A nominating committee comprised of one (1) member of the current directorate and two (2) members at large shall be appointed by the current executive. A notice shall be sent annually to all members requesting nominations for the directorate. The nominations must be received by the committee two (2) weeks prior to the Annual General Meeting (AGM). Nominations must bear the signature of two (2) nominators and the nominee. A nominee must be a member of the chapter.
- 3. A slate of candidates including all those properly nominated shall be proposed by the nominating committee for presentation at the AGM.

- 4. The directorate shall be elected at the AGM from the proposed slate of candidates.
- 5. The directorate will meet immediately after the AGM to elect the officers from its members.
- 6. The officers shall be Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary, Treasurer. The immediate Past Chair shall be an office ex-officio. The office of Secretary and Treasurer may be combined.

The main objective for this national event is to raise public awareness of the importance of engineering and technology in our daily lives; and to encourage young people to consider careers in engineering and technology.

National Engineering Week (NEW) activities give Canadians of all ages a chance to explore, discover and appreciate how engineering, science and technology contribute to our quality of life. The emphasis is on activities for youth that show how math and science can be fun and to demonstrate real-life applications of engineering. Founded in 1992, National Engineering Week is supported by Industry organizations, engineering societies, universities, governments agencies and professional associations representing over 200,000 professional engineers, technologists, and technicians.

The York Chapter main National Engineering Week event will be the Grade 7/8 design challenge. The main objective will be to design and build models of portable bridges that can be used to cross crevasses in the arctic ice pack. We are expecting an increased turnout this year, and we are looking forward to the opportunity to inspire more students to consider a career in science and engineering. We are looking for corporate sponsors of the event to cover the cost of prizes and refreshments. The budget for prizes are \$250 for first prize, \$200 for second prize and \$150 for third prize. Assistance in funding the refreshments would also be appreciated as well. We will also be looking for judges. Students at this grade level do not know that things cannot be done, so they frequently think "outside the box" and come up with designs that the engineers in attendance have not thought of. It is a real eye opener. The design challenge is schedule for Thursday, Feb. 25, 2003 at Sir William Mulock Secondary School in Newmarket, from 4:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.
