The design challenge involved building a model canopy walkway, including a hoisting system to move materials from the ground up to the walkway. The student teams were asked to:

Design and build a walkway that includes a 25 centimeter high

bridge (from the floor) that is 40 centimeters long (from one chair to another chair) and a pulley system that can raise a 14 oz. can from the floor to the seat of one chair. The bridge should be wide and strong enough to support a 14 oz. can for 30 seconds.

2) Sketch the walkway design in actual size, list the materials you plan to use and describe where you plan to use them.

In all there were 13 teams of grade 7 and 8 students, a total of 62 from 12 schools. All student participants received prizes and were treated to dinner. This was a substantial increase over the four teams that participated last year. The Education committee was well represented with over 8 volunteers partaking in the event.
