PEO felt it had no other option than to take this action regarding changes to the Ontaro Building Code to maintain the integrity of its exclusive jurisdiction over regulation of engineering under the Professional Engineers Act (PEA). n March 2005, Council approved the Strategic Plan 2005-

2009. The plan establishes PEO's strategic change agenda for the next five years by investing in the P.Eng. licence. Refer to PEO website for details.


OSPE Update n April 2006, Ontario Society for Professional Engineers (OSPE) started the Political Action Network (PAN). It engages in government relations activities advocating issues of importance to engineers. After the first PAN training session, Gregory Cook, P.Eng. (PAN volunteer) and I met with Frank Klees, Conservative MPP. The objective of the meeting was to develop relations and get his support for OSPE positions with respect to a number of issues important for engineers. A focus of the meeting was on repelling the proposed changes to the Limitations Act, which would waive the 15-year limitation period for filing claims for engineer-

ing services. Other topics included Quality Based Selection (QBS) and Calculus. Mr. Klees was receptive to presented OSPE positions and offered his support. John Schindler, P.Eng., Past Chair, Board member of OSPE
