C tarting 2004, PEO deployed a new funding formula for allotments to Chapters. It is no longer based on a fixed amount for each member-Ship in the Chapter, but strictly based on the activities of the Chapters. We submitted our Chapter's business plan to PEO by November 2003, requesting for \$107,110. We were surprised that our 2 Regional Councillors only allotted us \$17,644 without adequate explanation. 7 ffects of budget cut are reflected in the following cost-cutting measures:

- 1. Cut out one paper issue of the newsletters (publish the summer issue electronically)
- 2. Program events aiming at break-even costing
- 3. Eliminate ancillary costs for our Internet website

The total reduction in net expenditures will be about \$5,500 for this year. Our reserves will be reduced to about \$19,500, or about 58% of our spending, while PEO requires reserves of over 70%. We will submit our 2005 business plan by September 2004 and PEO advised we will know about our allotment for 2005, by December 31, 2004.
