ongratulations to Peter DeVita of York Chapter for win-✓ ning the election as Councillor-at-Large, Santosh Gupta of Scarborough Chapter as Lieutanent Governor Appointee to PEO Council, Ed Poon as a OSPE Director 2007, and Daniela Iliescu of Willowdale-Thornhill Chapter winning the PEO Member of the Order Award 2007.

- On May 17, PEO won its Building Code legal challenge at Ontario Superior Court of Justice. The ruling affirms PEO's exclusive jurisdiction in areas of building code compliance and activities relating to general review of construction.
- PEO AGM was held on April 28, followed by trainings on PRISM, new executive, and Government Liaison Program.
- Regional Councillors Committee (RCC) meeting was held after the AGM. Councillor John Vieth was elected as the Chair of RCC. RCC also approved:
- Increasing National Engineering Week funding to \$600 - An allowance up to \$250 for chapter committee meetings
- Chapter business plans for 2008 are due on June 23. The business plans from all chapters are combined to form the budget that RCC submits to PEO Council to allocate funding in the overall PEO budget.
- Internationally Educated Engineers Qualification Bridging program is a joint venture between PEO and Ryerson University for bridging the gap in academic requirements.
- Engineering Intern Training (EIT) Financial Credit Program waives application fee and first year fee for qualified EITs.

Two schools competing in the 2007 FIRST (For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology) Lego League had functioning robots. Design Challenge 2007

esign Challenge 2007 by York Chapter was initially scheduled on March 1st at the Newmarket High School, unfortunately mother nature had other plans. Despite 12cm of snow, white out conditions and cancellations of all after school activities on school premises, we rescheduled the competition for Thursday April 24th, 4pm to 8pm for Grade 7 & 8 students at the same venue. Other project management challenges of trying to find new volunteers and new judges did not deter us and the event was a resounding success with over 50 student and 10 teams. The theme of the challenge was to design and build a scaled portable arctic crevasse bridge capable of carrying a weight of 0.6kg can over a distance of 0.4m with different types of uncooked pasta in addition to straws, skewers, brass head fasteners, elastic bands, toothpicks and paper clips. Judging criteria included: weight of the bridge, cost of materials, collapsed length of the bridge and the ability to hold 0.6kg weight, preliminary concepts, detailed design and project management. The judges present were Matthew Xie P.Eng., 2007 York Chapter Chair; Gerry Meade, P.Eng., 2007 GLP Director, and Craig Doran P.Eng, founder of Design Challenge in York Chapter, who were able to come out and support the competition despite the short notice and their busy

schedules.

We also had tremendous support from York Region School Board representative Pam Turnbull and Art Niezen. Planning and event supports provided by Jeff Mark, Greg McIntosh, Joe Ciccone and Susan Treki (all P.Eng). Engineer volunteers Jon Mills, Kelvin Lo, Derek Cheung, Mandy Yu and Michael Chee, along with high school student volunteers Conrad and Brandon were there support the event.
